- o Admission into the BFA in Art Education Teaching Option is by application and is competitive.
- o Students must retain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher in Studio Art, Art History, College of Education, and Art Education courses. Students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- o Students will only be recommended for a student teaching placement if they have a 3.0 GPA average in the major (ARE, ART, ARH, EDP, LCEV, TLS, SERP courses) at the time that they are placed in a student teaching placement.
- o Students are required to repeat any AVCE and Education course in which they receive a D or lower.
- o Students must have a Fingerprint Clearance Card in order to visit schools and work with minors.
- o Students are advised in the School of Art's Student Advising Center.
- o Students are required to be on the School of Art's *Art Education Listserv*.
- o Undergraduates may double major with a BFA in Art Education and a BFA in Studio Art
- o Students approach their work with the highest degree of professionalism, specifically in terms of coursework, personal and professional dispositions, and the *University of Arizona Teacher Preparation Programs Professional Standards*.
- o You must meet the requirements of this checklist with your advisor and faculty advisor in order to graduate.

<p>Fingerprinting Requirement Date completed</p> <p>All students must be fingerprinted in ARE 230 and/or before taking College of Education coursework and ARE 300. Effective January 1, 2008, per Arizona State Statute A.R.S. § 15-106, all teachers and persons who are required to be fingerprinted to work in the classroom are required to have an Identity Verified Prints (IVP) fingerprint clearance card. <p>AVCE Portfolio Review Date completed</p> <p>All teaching option students are required to undergo a portfolio review during their program. Portfolio reviews usually take place two semesters before you student teach. Additional reviews may also be scheduled.</p> <p>Students must PASS the portfolio review if they are to be recommended for student teaching.</p>

All students are expected to be knowledgeable about *The University of Arizona Teacher Preparation Programs Professional Standards* and the Intra State New Teacher Assessment and Support Consortium Standards (InTASC). The contract will be given to you in your first art education class or in a subsequent class. The contract, once signed, will be placed in your file. ARE 493B Student Teaching Practicum (12 units) **Dates:**

Students will only be recommended for a student teaching position if they have at least a 3.00 GPA average in the major courses (Art Education, Studio, and Art History).

Students are required to student-teach in either a middle or high school setting for a minimum of 75 days. You will start your student teaching on the date your Supervising Practitioner starts the semester. In some cases you will be requested to stay after your teaching day to participate in duties as assigned by your Supervising Practitioner. You are required to attend a seminar after school at UA approximately twice monthly and complete assignments in addition to your student teaching practicum work. You may only student teach in a Tucson area school. Placements are found and decided upon in consultation with an AVCE faculty member early in the semester before your student teaching semester. Please be advised that students are **recommended for student teaching**; it is not a given that you will student teach when accepted into the BFA degree program. UA Graduates with a BFA degree in Art Education (Teaching option) who pass student teaching and the NES tests, and have met the SEI and US/Arizona constitution requirements are recommended for a Standard Secondary Teaching Certificate with a K-12 Art Endorsement.
